The Community Mental Health Hub at Hanna

Our new Community Mental Health Hub, located on the Hanna Center campus, delivers mental health services to youth of all ages and their families from across Sonoma County.

The Hub offers programming to address the mental health needs of Sonoma residents. Culturally competent services include Individual, Family and Group Therapies, Trauma-Informed Art-Based Activities, Parenting Workshops and more.

While the new building will have its grand opening in the spring of 2023, the Hub is now offering services in various locations throughout Sonoma County.

Residential Services

Hanna Center's Transitional Housing Program is designed to provide a safe and supportive environment for former foster youth, ages 18-21, who have opted to remain in foster care as designated Non-Minor Dependents. The program provides living quarters for participants on Hanna's campus and opportunities to work toward self-sufficiency and independence.

Vocational Training

In collaboration with local employers, associations, organizations and trade unions, Hanna Center's new vocational training program supports current students as well as alumni and transitional-aged youth in earning training certifications that will lead to potential internships and job placements.

The program is open to anyone in the community, 18 or older, who is looking for a viable career path.

Hanna High School

Hanna Center's High School transforms students into productive, healthy and compassionate young adults through nurturing, trauma-informed care and practices. Students develop trusting relationships with caring instructors, gain a sense of stability and consistency in their lives, and leave Hanna with a clear post-secondary plan.

Hanna offers a robust curriculum, including PE, art/music, and sports teams. Small classes are focused on providing students with the tools and support needed to earn a high school diploma and develop the skills and interests to continue their education and/or pursue a career.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

Hanna's reimagined CTE program is part of the core curriculum and focuses on four career tracks identified as high-wage and high-demand in our local economy: construction, health, technology, and culinary/hospitality.

First-year students will take intro courses in all tracks and will have the opportunity to dive deeper in the field of their choosing in later years, leading to internships, apprenticeships and union membership.
